Vision Resources

BadgerCare

- If your child is on BadgerCare they can receive an eye exam and glasses annually. Please call the number on the back of your child's health care card to find a vision care provider or you can look up your child's HMO contact number in the link here. Member services by phone at 800-362-3002.

VSP Vision Eyes of Hope

Eyes of Hope is a program that is available to assist children with the cost of an eye exam and glasses if needed. To qualify the following criteria must be met:

- Family income is at or below 200% of poverty level
- Child is not covered by Medicaid (BadgerCare) or any other vision insurance
- Child is 19 years old or younger and has not graduated from high school
- Child has not used a voucher during the last 12 months

Your student's health office works to obtain a certain number of gift certificates for families who qualify for this program. Please contact District Nurse, Stephanie Peplinski at Peplins@mcfsd.org if you are interested in more information.
