OPTIONAL FEES

Optional fees will be applied to all student accounts. Any unpaid optional fees will be removed from accounts at the end of November.

Student Athletic Pass: \$40.00 - for entry into all high school athletic events, except for hockey and WIAA tournament contests - these events have a separate cost at entry.

Athletics Fee: Athletes only - \$125.00 - Students wishing to participate in any of the offered athletics will be required to pay the athletics fee. The fee is required for each student and each sport they wish to participate in.

Yearbook: \$65.00 - Hardcover book of activities and fun memories throughout the school year. The yearbooks are distributed during the last week of school.

Music Boosters Donation: Suggested \$10.00 - Every parent/guardian is automatically a member of the Music Boosters by your son's or daughter's participation in the music program; however, we would like to encourage you to become a "dues-paying member" of the McFarland Music Boosters.
